Requirements

CD CHANGER IN TRUNK HATCH

Introduction

Many Mercedes Benz owners with a trunk mounted analog CD changer will be pleased to know they no longer have to disconnect the CD changer in order to connect and play an audio device.

The AUX-MB cable **requires and retains** the **analog CD changer**** to provide a 3.5mm dash mount audio jack which can be used to connect and play all kinds of audio devices including iPod, iPhones, Smartphones, Mp3 Players on the car system **without sacrificing the CD changer in select 1992-98 Vehicles**.


Installation

Warning: Keep in mind that most radios are coded and will not operate without code. Radio code must be available for radio to operate upon reconnection.

 Remove radio from dash to gain access to connectors. Pair of radio removal tools (See Fig. 1) required.




Fig. 3 Applicable radio

Slide tools into radio slots (See Fig. 3). (Straight edge facing away).
 Withdraw radio by pulling outwards. To release keys simply press retaining springs. See Fig. 2. For detailed radio removal click here.



This Mercedes radio does NOT apply

3. Disconnect CD changer 10-pin plug (See Fig. 4) from radio chamber (C) (See Fig. 5/6)

radio connectors




Fig. 6 10-pin connector/plug

Connect factory CD changer plug from step 3 to adapter harness 10pin connector (black) (See Fig. 6).

Connect adapter 10-pin plug (red) (See Fig. 7) to radio chamber (C) vacated in Step 3 as seen in Fig. 8

6. Carefully route audio jack (See **Fig. 9**) towards the front of dash or mounting location (within 4 ft.)

7. **Optional:** Drill a ¼" hole in dash or panel. Push jack threated shaft through hole and secure with nut (See **Fig. 10**)





Warning: Jack may be left freestanding, but to be mounted, ensure panel is <u>no thicker than 1/8"</u> otherwise shaft may not protrude enough to engage with nut. If necessary, use dremel, sander etc. to thin panel,

Operation

1. Connect your audio cable (See Fig. 11) or similar to audio device.

2. Press CD button on radio.

Note: At least one DISC must remain in changer magazine

3. On audio device, select a song using its built-in controls.

Warning: Playlist and Track selection is *NOT* possible from the Radio. You must use the audio devices built-in controls to access audio files.

- 4. Audio device should now be heard on car speakers
- Use radio volume knob to adjust playback level
 Note: if audio playback is distorted, please lower the volume on audio device.
- To listen to the CD changer, disconnect 3.5mm plug <u>from jack</u> and operate changer as customary.
- 7. If correct operation is confirmed go ahead and reinstall Radio

Important Notes:

The AUX-MB works on the 1992-98 Mercedes Benz <u>analog CD CHANGERS</u> - not compatible with digital applications (e.g., COMAND, Audio 10, 30, 50, PCM etc.)

Frequent ask questions & troubleshooting

- Does the AUX-MB work in vehicles without CD changer?
 NO; vehicle must have a working analog CD changer otherwise the AUX-MB will not work
- I own a 1999-Up Mercedes with CD changer. Will this cable work?
 NO; 1999-Up Mercedes CD changers (e.g., MC3198) is connected via fiber optics and therefore NOT compatible with the AUX-MB.
- My vehicle does not have a changer, but I want to be able to play smartphone; what adapter can I purchase from you?
 1994-98 Mercedes without CD changer requires our MBZ-AUX, AZD-MBR or MB-HF. Click links for details.
- Why is my CD changer humming, playing very low or distorted?
 Make sure audio plug (See Fig. 11) is disconnected from audio jack (See Fig. 9) Jack must be empty otherwise CD changer playback will suffer.
- 5. Does this cable degrade the sound from my device? The AUX-MB passes audio from device to the radio. If audio device playback is low, distorted etc. so will the output. This cable does not degrade or enhance the input. What comes in is what goes out :)
